



Terms of Sale

After buying one or more animals, you have several options concerning the disposition of your purchase:

1. Have the animal processed for your own consumption by one of the processing companies contracted by the Lamar FFA. It is the responsibility of the buyer to pay the processing charges. The following companies have representatives here this afternoon:

- . Keep the animal for oneself. It is the responsibility of the buyer to have the animal removed from the school grounds immediately following the end of the auction.
- 3. Private Treaty Agreement: This is an agreement/sale between the Buyer and student that the animal will be sold aside of the auction, (meaning the animal will not be auctioned off in the live auction) in a private agreement. <u>The Buyer must make payment to "Lamar Athletic Booster Club-FFA."</u> It is the responsibility of the buyer to have the animal removed from the show grounds immediately following the end of the auction.

Please note that animals must be removed from the tent and school grounds on the day of the auction.

In the event that you choose to have the animal(s) processed, please note the following:

- Rabbits will be processed at the student's expense and will be delivered to you at your convenience.
- All other animals will be processed at your expense. Animals will be picked up after the auction for processing by the company of your choice. Please see the company representatives here today to make appropriate arrangements.
- Contact the meat processor to place packaging instructions and arrange pickup of the processed meat.

All check payments are to be made payable to: Lamar High School (FFA)

Payment is expected the day of the auction.
